 - e. Coordinate outreach to Health Plans involved in LTSS initiatives.
 - f. Coordinate outreach to Board of Supervisors with organized presentation.

- g. Focus on hospital discharge planning to elevate regional service delivery models.
 - h. Examine successes of all coalitions and replicate with measurable goods.
