- c. Create a universal E-template for newsletter to elevate issues in a similar fashion.
- d. Articulate integrated care to medical field - working with physicians to understand CalMedi Connect, etc...

- e. Create a universal Comm Strategy with identical messages to be consistent when talking to public, officials, policy makers.
 - f. Organize an election forum with senior focused issues, which could include caregiver issues.
 - g. Expand senior needs survey used in Orange County, along with a gap analysis (see above)
 - h. Organize an outreach strategy to elected officials, including engagement with district offices.
 - i. Strengthen connection w/ the organizations serving both older adults and persons with disabilities.
